Victims isn't worth watching

Flaws turn film about AIDS into a threat to audiences

The Victims, a low-budget drama

filmed in Miami, is billed as the first theatrical feature about heterosexual AIDS. It's also billed as "the movie of the year," which might have been true if no other movies had come out in 1989. In any case, it is certainly inept, which is probably just as well.

For if *The Victims* were Hollywood slick instead of film-school clunky - that is, if it had any real

power — it might be dangerous.

Sexual slip-up

The premise involves a man who has been faithfully married for years and who belongs to none of the acknowledged high-risk groups. He is infected with AIDS by a single contact with a heterosexual woman. The film is promoted with this ad blurb: "If you don't want to catch AIDS, go see The Victims."

Ah, but the film is bad enough so that there's not much chance it will be taken seriously. The story concerns a Cuban/Turkish refugee (Roger Pretto) who lands in Miami illegally in 1967, struggles and subjects legitiment as well as '110 achieves legitimacy, as well as "legal" status, and rises to become a rich and powerful developer. He marries (Sherrie Rose) and has a

At about the time when the family seems on top of the world, he has the brief affair with his chief designer (Mary Louise Fanaro), who is seen, via flashback, to have contracted AIDS at a wild party (maybe drugs, maybe sex).

Quality is slight

Manny Diez's script has a few small moments of quality, particularly toward the end, when the estranged wife must decide how to put her family back together and how to deal with an unforgiving son.

But with the exception of Pretto's work, which is adequate (though no more), the performances are uniformly awful. No need for the director, the cinematographer or the sound track composer to feel smug,

Noble intent notwithstanding — and we're giving the benefit of the doubt here — this is a bad film in nearly every way.


